From the Pastor...

"Love your neighbor as you love yourself."

We have heard the command reinforced by Jesus that love is a gift from God and love is designed to fill up our entire being for the purpose of sharing it with our neighbors. In their book, The Art of Neighboring, Dave Runyon and Jay Pathak tackle a con-



versation about 'neighboring' which has grown into a movement of building healthier communities. A few years ago, twenty-one churches in Arvada, Colorado united to start a neighboring movement in their community. Dave and Jay said they kept things simple and challenged the people in their congregations to take the next small step with their literal neighbors. The movement spread, and to date over 1,000 churches are using the Art of Neighboring resources.

Just over a year ago, we experienced a natural movement due to disaster that stirred up some neighboring in our area and also left neighborhoods I believe we are still living into this new reality of long-term recovery. I also believe that most of life can be framed in 'recovery' terminology. We are a fallen, sinful, disobedient, selfish people who are constantly recovering our footing in the area of loving one another. The Art of Neighboring invites us into conversation about our daily practices of intentional loving. This conversation is timeless just as the timeless conversation God had with the first humans about how they were created to live, love, and recover from their selfish actions, reaching out toward others.

Join me on Sunday mornings in worship as we reflect on how we might take the commandment to love our neighbor literally, and how our time and fears are obstacles to overcome.

I'm looking forward to giving Thanks for new friends and connections as we to step forward and recover the great gift of each other. May God show us the way to bravely grow.

September's income** was \$31,659.57 with Castaway's income donation of \$8,000.00 for a total of \$39,659.57. Our expenses were \$32,679.40 leaving a net income of \$6,980.17. Year to date net income is -31,777.09. Although we continue to curb and watch our expenses, our giving income is lower than anticipated. It continues to be a challenge in the income area of our budget so I pray that we can reach deep to continue supporting the ministry at work here at FUMC Rockport.
