While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it an ate in their presence. Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you – that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures. – Luke 24: 36b-48

Friends, this is a season of new creation. The sightings of Jesus after his Resurrection cause a tension. This tension created by Jesus' death and resurrection is similar to the tension we have been living through recovery since Hurricane Harvey, the death of loved ones, significant health issues, financial uncertainty, and home stability. Disbelief and wonder are on the tips of our tongues: "How can this be?" "This is too much Lord!" "What are we going to do next?" "Is this for real?" "It's too good to be true!" "From where did this strange peace come?"

What I love about Jesus' response to our anxious questions is the way he sets a basic pattern for us to navigate these moments of being created new. For those who seek new life in the midst of disbelief and wonder Jesus uses the perfect question of distraction, "have you anything here to eat?" It refocuses the gathered on serving, it draws us to assess their resources for offerings, and it invites us to share space with his presence. Jesus in one simple question set up an environment for 'belonging' that encourages openness to understanding scripture.

Paul Rock writes in Preaching the Common Lectionary:

While the opening of the Scripture and the teaching are vitally important, they come after the fear has been dispelled and belonging has been established and a meal is shared. Recall what Christ instructs us to share until he comes again; it is not a lecture or an anthem or confession, but a meal. To repeat, regularly, the act of invitation of drawing together, of sharing food, of pausing long enough to lean in and touch and taste and be fed and filled together. Eating together is an essential part of Christian behavior, right up there with caring for the poor and gathering for worship.

Our strength does not come from our certainty. Our faith is not about etiquette. It's about community. It's about identity. It's about grace. And when we've touch grace and tasted community,

we can be witnesses, even while we continue to wonder, in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth.

I believe God is recreating our community for greater 'Belonging' and it will require us to draw strength and courage from the basic model that Jesus gave us for a faith community. So I invite you to ponder, "who do we need to invite to the table? Who needs to find a place to belong so that they can sit in Jesus' presence? Are there ways we can increase our readiness for the one who asks, do you have something to eat?"


Washing Hands and Prayer

News from the Salvation Army: They have a program that is designed to assist households in Hurricane Harvey affected counties with new furniture (from JCPenney) and mattresses (from Mattress Firm) at discounted prices. There are qualifications established by the Salvation Army to determine eligibility. This also includes a cash stipend based on eligibility. Note this program is based on loss, not based on income. If you, or someone you know, is in need of replacement appliances (stoves, refrigerators, etc) or mattresses damaged by the storm, please contact myself for a copy of the application. Good Samaritan's Food Pantry also has the application available.

There will be a Friends and Family CPR/AED session held on Wednesday, May 30th at 5:30 p.m. in Fellowship Hall Room 2. If you would like to have more information about providing community CPR, this class is for you. Please note, this does not include a card/certification from American Red Cross or American Heart Association. There is a sign-up sheet available on the receptionist desk in the front Narthex. Please note that class size will be limited to eight to ensure appropriate instruction.

May is National Stroke Awareness Month. A person experiencing a stroke can be treated if people have acted FAST - 80% of strokes can also be prevented. When in doubt, ask the simple questions below:

FAST is the acronym for things to check in a possible stroke victim:

- **F Face** / Does the face droop on one side when the person smiles?
- **A Arm** / After raising both arms, does one of the arms drift downwards?
- **S Speech** /After repeating a simple phrase, does the persons speech sound slurred or strange?
- **T Time** / If any or all of the above are observed call for 9-1-1 and ask for medical assistance.



Tree. Michaels talents also keep us tuned in during various services as he works in the sound booth. Michael has been active with Summer Camps, Mid-Winter,


BASIC, UMARMY, and our Costa Rica Mission Trip.
