"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you."

The honest truth is that doing the usual routines of daily life and work are still extremely difficult to accomplish. Ask anyone who grieves, experiences stress, suffers illness, loves other people, and suffers injury from this world and you can find a story of someone who is not yet healed. The reality is that though we can acknowledge we are not healed, we can in the same breath claim we are whole.

While researching America's Prosperity Gospel movement, Kate Bowler, a Duke University Professor, was saddened by its implications — namely that God is present in people's triumphs but not their suffering, and that every aspect of life is either "your fault or your reward." When Bowler was diagnosed with stage IV cancer at age 35, the prosperity-minded messages of well-wishers made cancer seem like a punishment.

In her book, Everything Happens for a Reason (and Other Lies I've Loved), Bowler asks: "What would it mean for Christians to give up that little piece of the American Dream that says, 'You are limitless'? Everything is not possible. The mighty Kingdom of God is not yet here. What if rich did not have to mean wealthy, and whole did not have to mean healed? What if being people of 'the gospel' meant that we are simply people with good news? God is here. We are loved. It is enough." (newsletter.newsletter July 2018)

In these days of recovery from natural disaster and already in this uncertain time we call 'Hurricane Season', I sense that our faith community is not healed, but whole.

Like our VBS teaching has reminded us, it is living completely in trust that God goes through the suffering 'waters' with us that makes us truly whole. Wholeness is the experience of peace, joy, love, acceptance, and life's adventure with Christ. This wholeness in Christ is found mysteriously in the broken community and the Sabbath rest it provides. It is an amazing honor to witness the brokenness of our lives create a powerful witness to God's sustaining formidable grace.

Our adventure continues...We still await our sanctuary windows, the final repairs on recreational areas, the in-

crease in children and staff at FLT, and the new creating God is doing in our midst. Our leadership is seeking steps that will continue to move us toward transformation and faithful expression of our desire to broaden our reach in disciple-making. My prayer is that we will find those steps clearly marked with peace, patience, and joy.

Thank you to Dennis Richardson who shared what God put on his heart at our last Church Council meeting. We definitely are reminded that God calls us to add disciples to our ministry. Here is the verse on Dennis' heart:

"Enlarge the site of your tent,
and stretch out the drapes of your dwellings;
don't hold back.

Lengthen your tent ropes
and strengthen your stakes."

May's income** was \$25,839.64 with Castaway's income donation of \$8,000.00 for a total of \$33,839.64. Our expenses for May were \$36,925.61 for a net income of \$3,085.97. Year to date net ordinary income is \$6,742.41. We are well within our expected expenses for the year and hope to continue to make up the small deficit as we maintain our faithful stewardship. Summer always proves to be challenging in this area of our ministry but as always we will continue to keep an eye on expenses to maintain fiscal responsibility.

The final billing from Restoration Management Company for hurricane remediation and repairs is \$1,651,945.60. That does not include the loss of contents at this time. The Actual Cash Value of contents lost, inventoried just after the storm, is \$115,517.91 with the Replacement Value of \$190,140.84. More contents have been submitted to the insurance company for evaluation and payment with figures to be determined. As the replaced items are reconciled to the inventoried list, we will receive the difference remaining for the Replacement Value. Those processes are still active. Church Mutual Insurance Co. has been faithful to their responsibility of processing our claim and continue to work with us to make us whole again. I share my mantra for this whole experience...'This is a marathon...not a sprint!'

Please keep your church in your prayers and consider how you can answer God's call to stewardship of your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness.
