Let's Keep 'Stepping'

As we near a complete year after Hurricane Harvey, I'm amazed at how far we have come and how far we still need to go. In our community, we are no longer protected by news cycles that focus on disaster or tragedy and then move on leaving such events out of sight, out of mind. The disaster aftermath is still present, hopefully lesser. For those who are still walking the path of long-term recovery from natural disaster, the reality of the 'marathon' is settling in. I don't presume to know all the details of what your daily marathon entails, only that we are running alongside of one another, together.

It strikes me that any thought of actually running a marathon has never crossed my mind. Oh, I am impressed, inspired, and in awe of those who enjoy running and take on the discipline of training for such events. For me, the imagery has to be translated into the kind of discipline required for regular daily life with God. The practices of prayer, worship, service, and sharing story is what keeps these feet moving forward as I acknowledge the full reality of each painful or light step. This is the 'marathon event' for which I signed up. My willing participation is a response to the gift of life given by God and it represents obedience to God's heart desire.

God desires for us to bring everything to him and lay it at his feet. God delights in being in relationship with us. This is for what believers are training. God wants to hold our hopes, our failures, our guilt, our shame, our surrender, our enthusiasm, our thanks and praise, our everything. Giving our life to God helps free us from dwelling in the past, enables joy for the day, and empowers the steps toward the future. This is the nature of our story within God's story.

So, August will be a time of recalling our past year but more importantly to celebrate the mighty presence of Christ who carries us, makes us STRONG, and holds a future brimming with blessings. Our future is a crown that never dies; it is eternal relationship with Holy God. Next to the Eternal, a marathon is just a warm-up exercise.


"So run to win. Everyone who competes practices self-discipline in everything."








Our Condolences




KIDS' ZONE @ Harvey Anniversary Weekend





June's income** was \$18,568.39 with Castaway's income donation of \$8,000.00 for a total of \$26,568.39. Our expenses for June were \$35,400.63 for a net income of -\$8,832.24. Year to date net ordinary income is -\$15,574.45. We are well within our expected expenses for the year and hope to continue to make up the current deficit as we maintain our faithful stewardship. Summer always proves to be challenging in this area of our ministry but as always we will continue to keep an eye on expenses to maintain fiscal responsibility.

I will be sending out the semi-annual contribution statements this week. It has taken a bit longer to get them out but there is so much happening right now that I had to make some shifts in processing the statements...I share my mantra for this whole post-hurricane experience...'This is a marathon...not a sprint!'


Mobile Health Clinic

But, as we've said so often, "Harvey changed everything." As helpers volunteered and were assigned tasks, schedules and availability changed, tasks were reassigned, while some people had to wait and see if they could help. Many of the church folk we count on to "do stuff" had already made plans for VBS week - rebuilding, vacations, doctor's and lawyer's appointments, family commitments, etc. And many of our helpers from previous years are no longer here. We were short-staffed from the outset. The good news is that the people who did fill key positions were amazing! Not to discount in any way the wonderful work of all who volunteered, four people stepped in to lead sessions and organize their teams:
