#### The Greatest Gift Has Already Arrived

"Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" 2 Corinthians 9:15

When I think of significant events throughout history and how well celebrated those events are, no event in history seems to come close to the enormous amount of word and song that celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus' arrival is truly a gift that continues to inspire word and song. Frankly, it is the greatest gift ever conceived, given, and received. If this is true and we accept it to be so, the next few weeks are especially important as we recall this great gift, honor its great value, and receive it anew.

Imagine the Magi receiving a sign that pointed them toward the birthplace of a child expected to change the world, even save it. I wonder if they continued to follow the life of Jesus as diligently as they had prepared for his coming? How did they honor the gift of Christ beyond the gold, frankincense, and myrrh? Did they find themselves year after year revisiting the story of their journey to Bethlehem? Can they teach us how to reopen this great gift every year? I believe so.

I've heard people describe their most memorable gifts and recount the thoughts and feelings present as the gifts were revealed. Whether large or small, young or old, expressions about great gifts articulate like this: "I remember the feeling of overwhelming joy when as a five-year old I found the bike by the Christmas tree." "It was a complete surprise but what made it such a great gift was that it was personal and came out of the giver's knowledge of me." "It was exactly what I wanted even though it wasn't on my list." "It was made with love."

Romans 6:23 reads, "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in

Christ Jesus our Lord." What a gift! Overwhelming joy, a complete surprise, personal, based on the Giver's knowledge of us, exactly what we wanted even though we don't put it on our list, and it is made with love. Indescribable to the tee as Paul wrote but recognizable as the Magi spoke. The mysteries of God's gifting are as fresh as each new person who seeks

to open such gifts. I hope to join the likes of N.T. Wright who reminds us signs of the gift come in 'an echo of God's voice in the creation and stars that surround us' (Simply Christian). Paul reminds us to seek in this way in Romans 1: 20, 'for since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that humans are without excuse.'

I hope that this Advent season will find us actively seeking the gift of Christ and that we are open to it anew. My prayer is that as we receive the great gift of love in Christ Jesus, indescribable and clearly seen; my prayer is that our hearts will be strengthened by the Holy Spirit and moved to share the good news of eternal life, forgiveness of sin, and overwhelming joy in Jesus. Friends, may we look for signs of God's great gift to the world and help others to see Jesus has already arrived. Amen.


