Where are you?

“⁸ They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹ But the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, “Where are you?”
Genesis 3: 8-9

God’s question is simply profound.

Where are you?

Stimulates the receptors of the soul that need extra help to perk up the hearing necessary for transformation of heart. It is not just a question of physical location. It is a question asked in the context of a faith story revealing to us the way of God with a people free to choose.

Where are you?

Communicates God is paying attention to the lives of Adam and Eve and to us.

Where are you?

Calls us from out of the trees called shame and guilt. It tells us that our methods of hiding and covering up are ineffective and unhelpful to the work and life that God has set before us.

Where are you?

Invites a response from those ready to hear truth. It invites us to give an account of our actions and thoughts. It invites us to bravely share feelings, hopes, and desires.

Where are you?

Challenges our sinful tendency toward isolation, self-pity, exclusion, and blame.

Where are you?

Combats the fear that captures our hearts when we make mistakes. It strengthens our resolve to learn and grow. It offers courage when admitting our vulnerabilities.

Where are You?

Restores with a powerful graceful voice. It is a voice that speaks in a sea trees waiting to be heard and trusted. It is a voice ready to speak words of blessing as those who hear come into the light naked and ashamed but ready for God to give what is necessary for covering. It is the voice that holds a “no fault” stance of perfect grace.

Where are you?

A good question that we might remember with the simple acronym W.A.Y. Isn’t it interesting that Jesus said I am the WAY that leads to life. And it is this same Jesus who spoke words of “no fault” from the cross, “Father – forgive them, they know not what they do.” As we enter into the season of Lent, we are invited into a season of answering this very question, “Where are you?”. **Where Are You** is a good start to find our WAY back into relationship with God, with each other, and especially to the ones needing to be found. It was not a question with the intent to incite division and draw battle lines. It is a question filled with graceful intent to

hold humanity (represented in Adam and Eve) accountable and responsible for participation in the whole care of creation.



May we hear the question.

May God bless us with his presence as we seek the WAY of Christ. May we discern through prayer, scripture, story and faithful listening the W.A.Y. we are to stand.

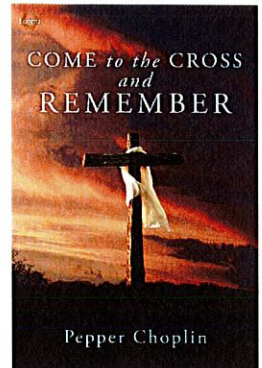
Easter Cantata Rehearsals

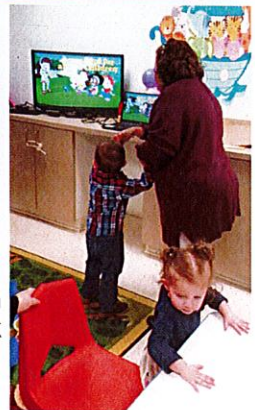
Equipping the Saints Worship Workshop
