How does one write a farewell?

Christ is with us.

Leave-taking can seem like a stormy time – conflicting emotions, imminent change, stressful relational dynamics, and tiring work. In Mark 4: 35-40, Jesus left behind the crowds and rested while a storm brewed around him and the disciples.

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stem, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up

and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?"

He rebuked them, yet they, like us, still had to learn faith is stronger than fear or loss. It is faith in the Faithful One that will sustain us. It is this powerful word of Christ that calms both the crowd and the threatening wind. "Peace! Be still!" are God's Word making us capable of bearing loss, fear, excitement, anticipation, comfort, discomfort, and anything else that God deems necessary for our growth and transformation. I firmly claim the promise that Christ's presence in the journey from one shore to the next is undeniably the source of Peace and can be counted on today and tomorrow.

I am so grateful for the presence of Christ with us during these past seven years. I want to thank all of you for the many ways you allowed me to be your pastor. As the years go by, I will look back with profound thankfulness on our adventure together in ministry and service; I trust the same will be true for you. I am forever blessed by the servant hearts in this place who have consistently persevered in serving the community and the local church. There are no words for the humbling and profound effect many of you have made on my life and ministry. The holy ground in which we've stood together in baptisms, confirmations of faith, weddings, funerals, family events, health issues, dreams, and disappointments is sacred; a means of God's grace poured out to us.

While I am leaving you to serve another congregation, there is one who remains constant: Jesus Christ. Jesus has been here from the beginning, and will be with you for the rest of time. If, through the power of the Holy Spirit, you allow Jesus to guide you, FUMC Rockport Congregation will always have a mission to make and grow disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the

world.

God continues on the journey ahead, just as surely as God traveled with Israel through the desert, was present in the uncertainty on the ark, and with Nehemiah and company rebuilding Jerusalem. And the leadership appointed to you for the next phase of the journey is certainly a part of God's next steps for this family of faith. I am confident in the gifts of Rev. Frank Baik and delight in how God will be working through him as your pastor.

Pray for him and his family, support them, offer them help as you are able, and work with them. I think that some of the words of instruction in the Baptismal Covenant are very appropriate for me to leave for you regarding them: Do all in your power to increase their faith, confirm their hope, and perfect them in love. Change is rarely easy and yet it does bring new opportunities to grow in faith and love. I relinquish all my pastoral responsibilities to him as I move to carry that role within another congregation. I pray you

will celebrate the beauty of the itineracy that allows for many gifted pastors to share time within various congregations as God has led

I will continue to hold you in my prayers. I praise God for every remembrance of you.

From our Future Pastor

Dear Rockport FUMC,

Our family is excited to be moving into the parsonage on June 27. I am looking forward to meeting many of you on the 30th as a visitor my first Sunday. I want to meet you and learn more about how things are done at Rockport. My prayer is that I would be able to bring fresh perspective to the great work you are already doing, and that my gifts will enhance what you already have. Don't expect radical changes the same month as your pastor changes, but do expect that some things will change in time.

One of the top three things that you as a church asked of the Bishop and DS was that the new pastor be able to understand the great trauma that Rockport suffered under Hurricane Harvey. I understand that life is defined by before and after Harvey. Everyone seems on edge around the sound of dripping. Some of you are just now moving back into your homes.

As an Army Reserve Chaplain I regularly work with people who have been scarred or traumatized. And I have counseled people as a Pastor on subjects of homelessness, abuse, and depression. I don't fully know your pain, I can't solve all your problems. (That's God's job). But I have a sense of what happened and the toll it has taken by your sharing. Thank you for being open and honest about the great suffering. I commit to listen to your stories and value your experience.

I haven't had to evacuate, return to nothing, and live in a camper for two years, but I too have been struggling with a house. Patty and I bought an investment house in Schulenburg just before Harvey hit, and have been working on it since. We took the 80+ year-old house down to the studs, and are still rebuilding. We recently turned on the water and are celebrating having a working toilet. So exciting!

I have been using skills that I first learned on mission trips, at Habitat for Humanity, and Volunteers In Mission. I was with the first Early Response Team after Harvey in La Grange, and the following week in Columbus. I have worked in Bastrop, Galveston, and Dulac, Louisiana after storm and fire.

I love mission work because I am gifted for it. I like helping people. Serving is natural for me. But more importantly, lending aid to a neighbor in Jesus name is one of the best ways to show them that God loves them. It tells them they are important to you. That you value them. When you represent the church, it says God remembers you. This body of believers cares for you.

When you serve someone in need, you don't have to look for an opportunity to share your faith. They ask you why you came. They say thank you, and open a door to

sharing why they are so important to you. When they experience love, it gives credibility to the words, "God loves you. Jesus died for you." Those words in conjunction with our service gives them the feeling of being loved. Work in faith will speak the Gospel truth.

I believe that through the storm, and recovery, Rockport is poised to do incredible ministry to our neighbors and beyond. Enjoy getting back into your homes. Rest some after two hard years of labor. But as the need arises, expect to be called to mission. You are uniquely gifted to know the pain of loss. The hope of recovery. And the joy of restoration. God didn't give you all this experience in home repair for nothing. God has a purpose for you.
