

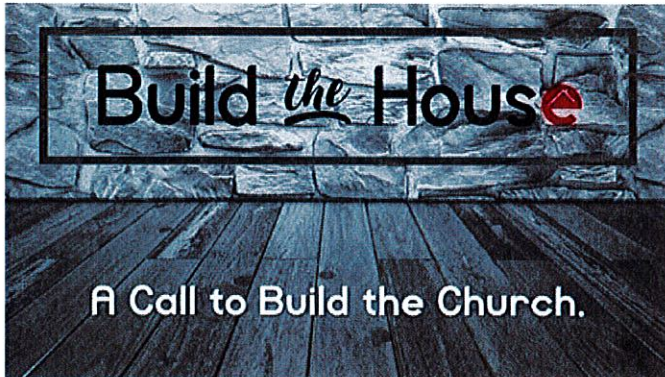

Part of the ministry of the church and the Wesley Nurse is assisting families and individuals with housing when all other resources have been exhausted. This month, a family with multiple medical needs came to see if the church would be able to assist with housing. They lost the home they had been renting prior to Hurricane Harvey and have been attempting to re-establish a place to live. Through hurricane relief funding at the church and the assistance of Salvation Army, we were able to provide financial assistance with temporary housing and the rent deposit at an apartment complex in Corpus Christi. This family will now have a permanent place to live that is in proximity to the medical care they need. What a blessing to be able to assist a family in establishing a new home.

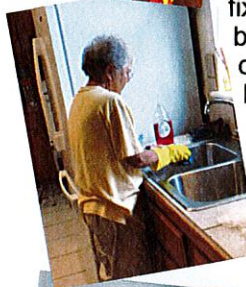

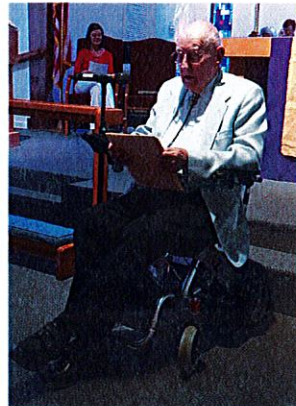
Fresh Paint!

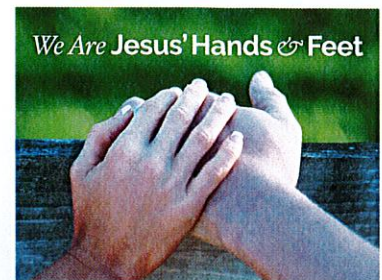
