

Did you know that in addition to our "church building", we also have:

- First Learning Tree,
- the Education Wing classrooms,
- a garage for the church and Castaways storage,
- five apartments across from Mac's BBQ,
- a vacant lot next to FLT (with plans for future use),
- · a fully-stocked tool trailer for mission work, and
- a Parsonage (including a storage shed) in the Country Club?

That is a LOT of real estate! And a LOT of AC units, toilets, drains, water heaters, furniture and equipment to maintain. Plus a LOT of landscaping to maintain!

Your Trustees—Kathy Daniels (Chair), Joe Wilson, and Danny Hale—along with Ray Saenz, Jeannie Coe, Susan Jamison, and a WHOLE LOT of willing volunteers are at work behind (and in front of) the scenes to keep things running smoothly.

Over the past year, your church has completed the following projects:

- Parsonage Restoration: interior and exterior paint, installed carpet, install new appliances, landscape front flower beds, removed two dead trees, weather stripping installed, repair garage door frame, windows washed;
- Church Main Street entry painted, furnishing updated (ongoing project);
- Ladies bathroom in the Fellowship Hall painted, furnishings updated;
- · North and East exterior of Church power washed and painted;
- · Sanctuary Stained glass windows installed;
- · Main Street entry steps and breezeway sidewalk painted;
- Fellowship Hall walls and various other areas touched up with paint;
- Sliding/folding doors in the Fellowship hall repaired;
- Motorized/handicap doors installed at Live Oak and Breezeway entries;
- Fencing and artificial grass installed in Social Area;
- Wesley Nurse's Office updated with new cabinets;
- Closet in Adm Asst Office was painted;
- White picket gate on the Education Wing removed (ongoing project);
- Breezeway "ceiling" installed and painted;
- Drainage pipe installed along wall in flowerbed to prevent water entry into building;
- Atrium doors repaired;
- Roof over the Nursery repaired;
- Mold removed, new HVAC units installed, insulation installed and roof repaired in Education Wing rooms;
- HVAC units installed that service the Hallway and ladies/mens bathroom in fellowship hall;
- Ceiling tiles painted in various rooms in the Fellowship Hall.

Just like a house (and this is actually the equivalent to a whole neighborhood of houses), there is ALWAYS something that needs to be done!



#### Less of You to Love Wednesdays @ 12:06 PM

Are you tired of the whole DIET thing? Are you fed up (pun intended @) and frustrated? Are you beating yourself up because it seems you just can't lose weight... or even worse, beating yourself up because you have actually gained weight?? Have you just given up?

Here is an opportunity to get off the weight loss merry go around once and for all! We'll look at what the Bible says about healthy living and move on from there!

Get ready and remember, there will be Less of You to LOVE!!

### Take Care of You



Despite their striking colors—ruby red, golden yellow, and even candy-striped—beets aren't exactly the most popular vegetable on the block. But what if you make them sound more enticing? It turns out that people may eat more "dynamite chili and tangy lime-seasoned beets" than plain old "beets".

In a study done at Stanford University cafeteria, researchers found that people ate about 25% more vegetables if the selections were described in indulgent terms rather than basic or healthy terms (such as "lighter-choice beets with not added sugar") even though all the dishes were prepared exactly the same way.

Other examples of indulgently named veggie dishes included "zesty ginger-turmeric sweet potatoes" and "sweet sizzlin' green beans and crispy shallots". So if you're hoping to entice friends or family to try beets (or other vegetables), add some appealing adjectives to the description.

Nutritional info: Beets are a good source of the B vitamin folate and the mineral manganese. Beets also contain naturally high levels of nitrates, which your digestive system converts into nitric oxide. This compound relaxes and widens blood vessels, which, in turn, lowers blood pressure.

East Recipes: Peel beets, then grate or slice into thin rounds. Toss with lime juice and a pinch of chili powder (or more to taste). You can also roast beets (wrap in foil and bake at 400 degrees F until tender) or pickle them.
