



The Caring Cards ministry is an important connection that bonds our church family together.







The Call to Jim Alpheson

The church year was fast coming to a close, and new leaders from the congregation were needed. That process falls on the Lay Leadership Committee, which met in early September. Open positions were carefully considered and matched to people, not an easy task. But the Committee members felt good about the decisions made, and the job of contacting nominees fell to me. If their response was positive, final approval would be no more than a formality at a Charge Conference.

Calling well over a dozen of nice people can be indeed a pleasant time. And it was! Almost all quickly said "yes", frequently leaving time for a little chat. A few needed a bit more information about the responsibility, but with my encouragement, accepted. Only one or two were unable to take on these duties. One even suggested being considered for an additional position for the next year! T

his important function for any church, regardless of its size, brought me to doing some more thinking. How important, I thought, is each congregational leader during these times! For example, our country is painfully divided today, with more derision and disdain and old-fashioned hate than I can recall in all my octogenarian years. And now our global Methodist church is almost certainly headed for a splitting into two or more non-friendly factions. Local churches and their pastors will be forced to make some unsavory and difficult decisions, and undoubtedly some people will leave their church families. The decline of Methodism, both worldwide and locally, may take a steep curve downward.

And there is little that we, the ordinary pew sitters can do. Just sit and watch.

Or is that really true?

Earlier I described my pleasant duty of calling people to serve their church. I then remembered the calling, the choosing, of twelve men from the large crowds following the young rabbi from Nazareth to be his closest disciples. These men would learn, not only from what their rabbi taught, but also from observing what he did and how he handled himself in some very trying situations. Some of them blossomed from being unschooled fishermen into becoming learned and wise and eventually leading the small group of new believers into a world changing movement.

We all know the names of Peter and Andrew, of James and John, of Philip and Matthew. They were all called to be followers and to be do-ers. Jesus called them to go out and to be with people and to explain who Jesus was and to help them understand what Jesus was saying.

And in a sense that was my duty when I was calling all those potential new leaders of our church family. They were being called to be a member of a committee or to have some leadership role.... and also to be with people and to help make the message of Jesus more meaningful.

But most of us are not being called to be a such-and-such in our church, not to have some special title. That realization brought me to another thought. Most of us are called by Jesus simply to "be."

Just to be like Jim Alpheson. Who?? Jim Alpheson!

No, Jim is not a member of our church. And I didn't call him. But Jesus did. You see, Jim Alpheson, would be the modern name for one of the Twelve, James son of Alphaeus. I believe he was only mentioned as being one of the disciples. Never are we told about who he was or what he did, which brings me to another thought.

think that many of us are meant to be Jim Alphesons.... called simply to "be." We are called, like James son of Alphaeus, not to be anybody special, but to go out and be present with people, to encourage, to share a few moments, to help when needed.

No, this James never made the biblical headlines, but Jesus saw him to be somebody who would do quiet important things without personal recognition. Our church, every church, needs Jim Alphesons!

We are all called to "be." And with an army of Jim Alphesons in our church, in every church, there will be no decline, no disintegration during crises. Instead there will be revitalization, new growth, and excitement.


