Dear Bishop Robert Schnase, and Rev. Laura Brewster,

Thank you for being shining examples of integrity, and love during a very turbulent time in the church. I continue to be impressed with Christ in you, and the grace I see in you. What we do in trying times shows our true character, and I have found you both to be exceptional.

You are busy people, and I've tried to help by not causing grief, and staying out of your way. But last week I was convicted that paying apportionments, and staying out of the way are not enough. I'm sorry for neglecting you in prayer, and not being more encouraging. I commit to pray for you, and the next pastor of Rockport FUMC daily at least till June 2023. May the Lord renew your joy and strength, protect you from evil, and bless and prosper your inner being, and your work and ministries. God guard you, your families, and deliver you from evil. And may God build the church to be. Amen.

I was impressed to pray for you while attending the GMC Annual Conference. I was there as a guest to see if they were my people, or if I continue to seek another denomination. I felt my heart warmed and I will be applying to transfer my ordination to the GMC effective **June 30, 2023**.

I plan to apply for mobilization through the Army Reserve and serve full-time as an Army Chaplain starting around June. I will work with the new pastor, and the SPRC for a smooth transfer. And will remain endorsed through UMEA until endorsed by another Endorsing agency.

This is a decision made with many tears. My grandparents were among the first converts in Korea through Methodist missionary Henry Appenzeller. My grandmother and my mother went to the girl's school he founded. My Father retired in the Cal-Pac Conference after a lifetime of service as an

Elder and is a strong advocate for staying with the UMC.

I was baptized, certified, discontinued, recertified, commissioned, and ordained in the UMC. I struggled to be ordained for 14 years, but persisted because my conscience would not allow me to teach Calvinism. Becoming an Elder in full connection is my crowning achievement, and now I lay it down after only 8 years of appointed service.

For years, I managed to focus on the good. Our reputation of being full of grace, and the hands and feet of Jesus. I downplayed our reputation of being doctrinally lax and confused. In fact, I celebrated the big tent. That we could have liberty and charity in non- essentials. Sure most UMC pastors (including me) can't evangelize to save their lives, but we embody love and good works.

But it's clear we are divided in basics like heaven and hell, and Salvation through Christ alone. I'm sure you've heard it too, "There may be other ways," Is a common refrain among UMC pastors. The first time I heard it was from a Seminary professor. Since then, half the elders I've talked to about salvation are not sure or comfortable with Jesus' exclusivity. I'm not so naïve to believe there will be doubts in any church, but I think those teaching Seminary should embrace the exclusive claims of Jesus Christ such as, "No one comes to the Father but by me." All these pastors said the right things before the ordination board. Can we not do something about what they are saying today? The UMC still has some firebrands, and I am thankful for those who have formed me. For times when my heart was warmed at Annual Conference, and services. For the moving of the Holy Spirit at services and retreats.

I believe in going on to perfection personally, and the church can too. I long to be part of a reform and holiness movement, like I read about in the discipline. I desire a body with this same longing. Of my three children, all of them want to affirm their friends who are gay, bi, or trans. I pray my kids will continue to worship and devote themselves to God through a Wesleyan church. But I also pray that they will love Jesus more than relationships, comfort, or easy lifestyle. That they will deny their flesh and see God's redemption. That loving rebuke will be part of their friendships.

Last year, my youngest graduated HS. She is my baby, and I enjoy having her in our home. But our goal is not to live under the same roof for the rest of our lives. My hope is that she will grow up and be self-sustaining. Get her own place, build her own family and life. But we will always be family. I will always love her. Similarly I feel like it's time for me to move out of the UMC, but we will always be family. We have one Abba. There will be reunions, meals, cooperation, and joint ministry. Thank you for your blessing and freedom to seek my own path. And the grace with which you handled the fracture of our conference.

I disagree with my kids, and love them. I also disagree with the UMC and love you. I love your heart for embracing those hurt by the church, and am grateful that you will share Good News with a generation increasingly distant from the knowledge of God.

I am in your service and will do what I can to advance the mission till June, and I hope we will have partnerships later. I continue to affirm that all people are created in God's image, and there is no one that is beyond the reach of Jesus' redeeming blood. Thank you for hearing me out.
