Mark 10:13-16 says, "People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." From this scripture you can see how important children are to the kingdom of God and that it is our responsibility to foster a loving, warm, and welcoming environment to all the children we serve. I believe the gifts and strengths our congregation has are those of real and valuable personal connections. You are the ones that will make a significant difference to the children that come to our church, you are the ones that these children will look up to as examples of how to live a positive Christian life.



I can honestly say that this cantata has been one of the most fun to put together. In the Words of Joel Raney, the composer of "Joy!": "There are many definitions of the word "gospel," but two

favorites are: (1) the story of Christ's life and teachings as narrated in the New Testament, and (2) impassioned, rhythmic, and spiritual music rooted in African-American churches of the American South. I've wanted to bring these two definitions together in a musical work for a long time, because what's more joyful that the good news of Christ's birth and what sounds more joyful that gospel music?"

Joy! Tells the story of Christ's birth through six choral anthems in a variety of styles based on familiar Christmas carols and original material. There are upbeat bluesgospel numbers as well as slower ballads in a gospel groove, plus one calypso tune.
