














A Note From our Castaway Volunteers:

This is a DVD-led class, and we have a lot of fun! Modifications are available for all fitness levels. After the exercise portion of class, we watch short educational videos related to stroke, high blood pressure, etc. These have been well received and we have learned a lot from them. We are having Friends & Family CPR class in **February (possibly 2/16)** for staff, ushers, & class leaders. There will be a 2^{nd} class open to church members scheduled for March. Please let me know if you are interested in attending the 2^{nd} class. The class will last approximately 2 hours and you will learn chest compressions along with how to use the AED.

The Emergency food pantry continues to serve the community daily. It is nice that I have items here to deliver out into the community. I always refer clients to Good Sam's 1^{st,} but I am thankful I can help when Good Sam's is closed. Joyce Palmer, Lore Norsworthy, & Raylene Whitaker are helping me keep it organized and clean. Thank you, ladies, for volunteering.

Please stop by the office soon and I will give you a tour.

I could use hygiene items including liquid body soap, shampoo, deodorant, razors, shave cream, and toothpaste. Also, I can use new or gently used men's shoes. Sizes 9-11 are most requested. Thank you all for keeping the pantry/closet well stocked.

The recipients are extremely gracious and blessed by your generosity.


