I pray that you had a chance to "Let Go" of whatever might be holding you back from a closer relationship with Christ as you took the time to repent and reflect remembering that "God did not send his Son to condemn the world but to save the world through him" (John 3:17). As we move forward into April, I want to continue to live in the hope of Easter with a 3-week sermon series called "Love reigns!"

Michael Barlow is the lead instructor for Team OMA submission fighting which is the Jiu-Jitsu club we open our fellowship hall to. Michael brings so much to our community through this organization with his low to no cost opportunity to learn Jiu-Jitsu, which is allowing some of our lower income families to enjoy this amazing experience. Michael is a devout Christian and teaches his students to stay focused on and trust God is all areas of their lives through prayer and scripture.

Renewing Christian Disciples, Strengthening Local Churches

The next Walk to Emmaus is a <u>Woman's walk and is scheduled for June 20th through 23rd</u>. Right after that, there will be a <u>Men's walk on August 1st through 4th</u>.

Here are some frequently asked questions about the Walk to Emmaus:

Is the Walk to Emmaus for all Christians?

Yes! While the Walk to Emmaus program is operated under the umbrella of the United Methodist Church, all Christians are welcome to attend.

I am already active in my Church. What does the Walk to Emmaus offer me?

Walk participation allows you to be involved on a broader level, connecting with other Christians who are also building the community for Christ.

How much walking is involved?

The "Walk to Emmaus" refers to the Bible Gospel of Luke 24:13-35, when Jesus walks alongside two disciples following his resurrection. As a Pilgrim, you only walk from the conference facilities to the dormitory next door for example. Golf carts, drivers and other assistance are available if you have mobility issues.

Are walks Coeducational?

No. Separate Walks to Emmaus are provided for men and women pilgrims.

Are Walks Activities Confidential?

Yes. Walk team members often share deeply personal aspects of their spiritual lives. Walk participants are expected to keep all information shared during the weekend confidential. To maintain this confidentiality, taking, sharing and posting photos and/or videos of Walk activities are not allowed.

Are there "Secrets" surrounding Walk Activities?

There are no secrets. There are wonderful surprises waiting for pilgrims willing to participate fully in the weekend. Walk speakers often share very personal and private details of their lives. Walk participants are asked to maintain the confidentiality of those shared life stories.

I'm certain there are more questions yet. Please come see me, Pastor Mel or anyone else that has already been on a Walk.




The Solar Eclipse in Texas on April 8th 2024:

Enters State: 12:10pm Totality Begins: 1:27pm Totality Ends: 1:49pm Exits State: 3:06pm

Through Texas, the speed of the Moon's shadow will accelerate from about 1580 miles per hour to about 1850 miles per hour.

Here in the Coastal Bend, we will see a partial eclipse, 93.5%. DO NOT LOOK DIRECTLY AT THE ECLIPSE WITHOUT PROPER EYE PROTECTION!



Hi Church Friends,

Can you believe it is already April? The wildflowers are beautiful, and I love how all my plants are coming back to life.

The Diabetic Education and Support Group continues to meet at 12:00 noon on the 2nd Tuesday of each month in the Recreation Room. This month we will meet on April 9th and will be playing My Plate Nutrition bingo. We recently had nutritionist, DeAnn Hill, and MHM's pharmacist, Dr. Lopez speak to the group about the new diabetic medications and nutrition. Please feel free to join us any time for more healthy eating and nutrition information.

Also, our Seniorcise chair exercise class meets on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays at 10:00 am in the Fellowship Hall. Maggie Allen leads chair yoga on Tuesdays. There are modifications for every level of ability. You can stand or sit to participate in the class. We had a great turn out and are having a lot of fun. I hope you can join us soon!

My practice continues to grow! I feel extremely blessed to be able to continue to bless others with your help! I had a total of 92 patient encounters in February and 78 encounters in March. I continue to see a great need for housing assistance, gas cards, and always food and clothing. I spend a great deal of time assisting clients with navigating their many needs focusing on mind, body, and spirit.

My emergency food pantry is running a little low on supplies. I could use pop top soups, canned meats, peanut butter, crackers, and bottled waters. I serve hot meals to unsheltered individuals several days per week. The members of the community who are unhoused come in and love to have a cup of coffee, a warm meal, a place to feel loved, and a prayer. My husband, Joseph, keeps the freezer stocked with stew, chili, spaghetti, etc. but with the increase of individuals and meals served, Frozen tv dinners could help with keeping this part of my ministry moving forward. I truly appreciate all the donations and support.

Update on patients that you guys have been helping me support. I have 3 patients, 2 of whom were unsheltered, and 1 who was very close to living on the street. They are all now working or receiving disability, and they all have housing. That is a God send for sure!

Also, MHM's Medical Legal Partnership has been instrumental in helping individuals with their disability cases and they were also very supportive of a young, single mother with 4 girls. She needed assistance preparing for her child support hearing case.





February was an extremely busy month. I helped host an event at Good Samaritan's. Individuals who receive any type of government assistance can qualify for a free cell phone. We were able to distribute 5 cell phones and 2 of those individuals were veterans.

I also set up a booth showcasing the Wesley Nurse program, advertising the services I can assist with and the classes that I offer at the Aransas County Health Fair. That is always a fun event and a great way to connect with other organizations in the area.

We held Friends and Family CPR in February with 14 church members who were trained in compressions only CPR and AED training. We also received Narcan training which is used in case of an opioid overdose. Thank you all who attended and thank you to Patricia Arnold for offering this service to us for free of charge.

I spoke at the Aransas County Retired Teachers meeting about heart health and the WN program.

Then to finish the month I assisted with the Food Handler's course where 58 individuals received their certification. Methodist Healthcare Ministries also sponsored a purse bingo table for the Odyssey after school learning and care program. We always have a great time there!

Wooh! February was a busy month!

Don't forget we are serving at Community Table on April 2! It's a fun event and we get to connect with so many members of the community.

As always, I am open for your input and ideas that will better help me serve the community and congregation. Thank you all so much for your continued support and prayers. They are appreciated more than you know. My door is always open and God bless you all!

DID YOU KNOW?

Earth Day is an annual event on April 22 to demonstrate support for environmental protection. First held on April 22, 1970, it now includes a wide range of events coordinated globally by Earthday.org (formerly Earth Day Network) including 1 billion people in more than 193 countries.

The official theme for 2024 is "Planet vs. Plastics."



Earth Day 1970

President Richard Nixon and First Lady Pat Nixon plant a tree on the White House South Lawn to recognize the first Earth Day.

The seeds that grew into the first Earth Day were planted by Wisconsin Senator Gaylord Nelson. An ardent conservationist and former two-term governor of Wisconsin, Nelson had long sought ways to increase the potency of the environment as a political issue.

The extraordinary attention garnered by Rachel Carson's 1962 book, *Silent Spring*, the famous 1968 *Earthrise* NASA photograph of the Earth from the Moon, the saturation news coverage given to the Santa Barbara oil spill and the Cuyahoga River catching fire in early 1969 led Nelson to think the time was ripe for an environmental initiative.

As a result of interactions with his staff and with Fred Dutton, a prominent Democratic operative who had been Robert Kennedy's presidential campaign manager, Nelson became convinced that environmental teach-ins on college campuses could serve as such a vehicle.
