Lent is a special church season where we spend the 40 days (not counting Sundays) from Ash Wednesday, to Holy Saturday, the day before Easter, remembering Jesus' suffering and death.

Almsgiving, which is traditionally practiced during Lent by those of the Catholic faith, is an act of giving food or money to the poor. You can do this with your child quite easily by letting them put money in the offering plate at church.

God reached down to us through Christ, so we can take the chance to reach out to others and show them the love of Jesus! Have a friend over for coffee or a family over for supper.

Hospitality can be on the go, too. Bring something to someone: a meal to someone who is sick or a mom with a new baby or go and visit someone in a nursing home or care facility (if you're not sick!).

You can also show your child how they can share what they have with others through an act of service. Some ideas would be:

- Sending a card to a loved one with a picture or verse about Jesus
- Sending a video message to a far-away family member
- Helping a sibling or parent at home with a chore
- Shopping with your child for gifts for a children's home


Easter Sunday will have a brunch in place of Sunday school classes. We encourage fellowship not only with your immediate family, but with the whole church family.

ABOUT ERT TRAINING

Early Response Teams (ERT) are specially trained teams that offer assistance soon after the disaster strikes. They generally do cleanup work and tasks required to stop further damage from being done, e.g. putting tarps on damaged roofs and removing damaged sheet rock and the flooded contents of a home. They might do minor repairs that help make homes habitable, but they do not do extensive repairs or reconstruction (that is the job for Long Term Recovery). Although the majority of ERT volunteers are in their 50s or 60s (those are the people who have time to volunteer), the work is physically demanding and may require working around mold and other allergens. ERTs may be asked to work on roofs or in hot spaces without air conditioning.

All members of an Early Response Team are required to complete the eight-hour training course and must have a current background check. The ERT training is done according to UMCOR guidelines and policies. The background check is completed upon completion of training through UMCOR. This background check is mandatory and is covered in the cost of training. Persons completing the training and passing the background check are issued a badge indicating they are approved by the Rio Texas Conference and credentialed by UMCOR for three years. ERTs will also comply with Rio Texas Conference Trusted con Confianza guidelines when they deploy. This is in addition to the UMCOR background check. As such, all ERTs are encouraged to complete the Trusted con Confianza training as soon as possible (feel free to do it before the class!). An Early Response Team is a special type of VIM Team

An Early Response Team has a very narrow function and has no management or administrative responsibility for the overall disaster response. An "Early Response Team" should not be confused with a Disaster Recovery Team. An Early Response Team is a specially trained and certified team called to do early response. A Disaster Recovery Team is a type of UMVIM Team that comes to assist in the long-term recovery, AFTER early response is completed. Each Early Response Team member must be trained and carry an identification badge reissued by UMCOR following successful completion of Early Response Team Training.

Hybrid Training - Is conducted in (2) 4-hour sessions over two separate days. It consists of a four-hour remote (online via Zoom) session and a four-hour "practical" session done in-person.


A few weeks later, we will have Spring Break from March 11th-15th. This week we will learn about safety, so if you would like to come speak on the subject, we would love to have guest speakers.

What Bible stories are linked to Lent?

Today, Lent is connected with the 40-day fast that Jesus undergoes

(Mark 1:13; Matthew 4:1-11; Luke 4:1-13).

Mark tells us that Jesus was tempted by Satan, but it is in Matthew and Luke that the details of the temptation are fleshed out.

All three accounts say that Jesus went without food for the 40 days.



WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is a 40(ish)-day season of the Christian Year that is a time of preparation for Easter. It is typically observed as a time of simple living, prayer and fasting. In 2024, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday [February 14, 2024]. Sundays are not counted as part of the 40 days of Lent, as they become invitations to refrain from fasting in celebration of "little Easters".

What is Lent about?

Many spend the time in self-examination and reflection as modeled by Jesus in Matthew 4: 1-11 where he prayed and fasted for 40 days before beginning his ministry.

What happened during those 40 days of fasting and praying in the wilderness? Our friends at the <u>Upper Room</u> say that maybe Jesus needed some time with God to sort through the major changes happening in his life. Maybe he needed a break from family, friends and his regular routine in order to see God [and himself] more clearly. Maybe he sought more time with God as he searched for direction and answers to the question that we, too have from time to time: "Who am I called to be?"

We, too are invited into this time of introspection.

What is a Lent devotional?

Any Lent devotional is simply an invitation to reflect on God's presence and movement in our personal lives through the season.
